

# ① Chairmans Report 2009

Looking back over 2009 we have seen a few high spots and a few disappointments. Our failure to secure a suitable P/M and L/D to conduct our P/M L/D weekend, and our failure to get the PDQB course of the ground in January as hoped was disappointing. <sup>also</sup> The loss of our second branch contest at ASHTBOURNE The fact that we only have 12 bands now in branch membership leaves us on the minimum number to form a branch. However the fact a few bands scratched on the morning ~~had~~ meant there were a few gaps in the spectators entertainment. It would be very shortsighted and selfish if we were to expect Birmingham city

Council to plan and fund a just a pipe band contest for 200 pipers and drummers.

I cannot emphasize enough that if we are to keep

Birmingham City Council on board with the use of their facilities and funding we must be prepared to entertain, and ensure we fill the day from start to finish.

If we get their financial support for 2010 there will be restrictions on Centenary due to the new Library being built on the adjacent car park. This will not affect the Contest but D/N and tuning areas will have to be resited. We should all do our best to ensure the continuation of the contest in such a good location.

Looking to the future, whilst our finance report suggests we are reasonably healthy, a few PDQB Courses and P/M L/D weekends will soon drain our resources, and to that end we will be contacting Birmingham City Council to help us raise funding.

(They have a department that helps local organizations to raise grants, Arts Council, Lottery or local funds that exist for education purposes.) The next task is to get our Branch massed band formed, by talking to our P/M and L/D at our next Seminar. The ... reversal drum salute would have been a great attraction at the Birmingham contest this year. drummers I have spoken to this past year have been

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on favour, we have the best drumming tutors  
in the Country so why not?

Finally, we are putting together a good team  
here in the Midlands Branch and I would like  
to thank them for their dedication to their work.  
This past year, the addition of Nicola as  
education officer and Bill as publicity officer ~~and~~ can  
only strengthen the team, and if we keep  
competing, educating and entertaining the  
future for the Midland Branch is Rosy.
